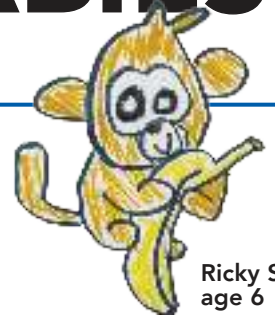

Be a good egg and unscramble the baby names around the frame of the puzzle on page c.

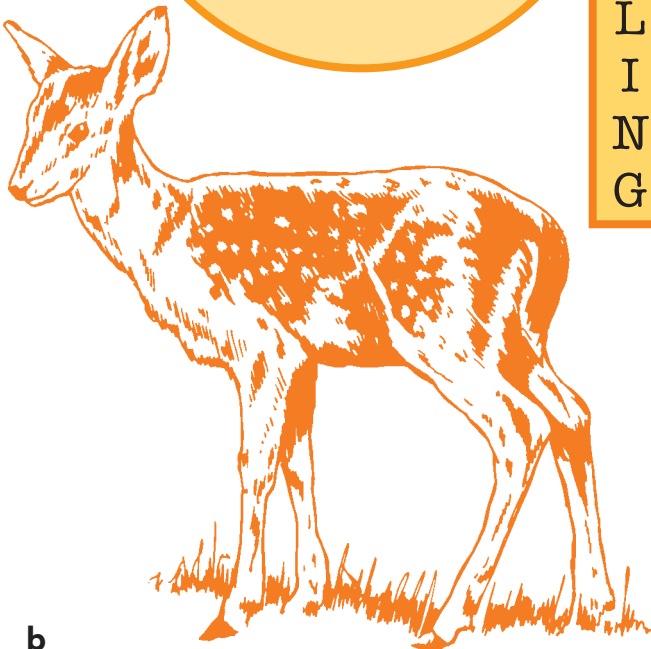

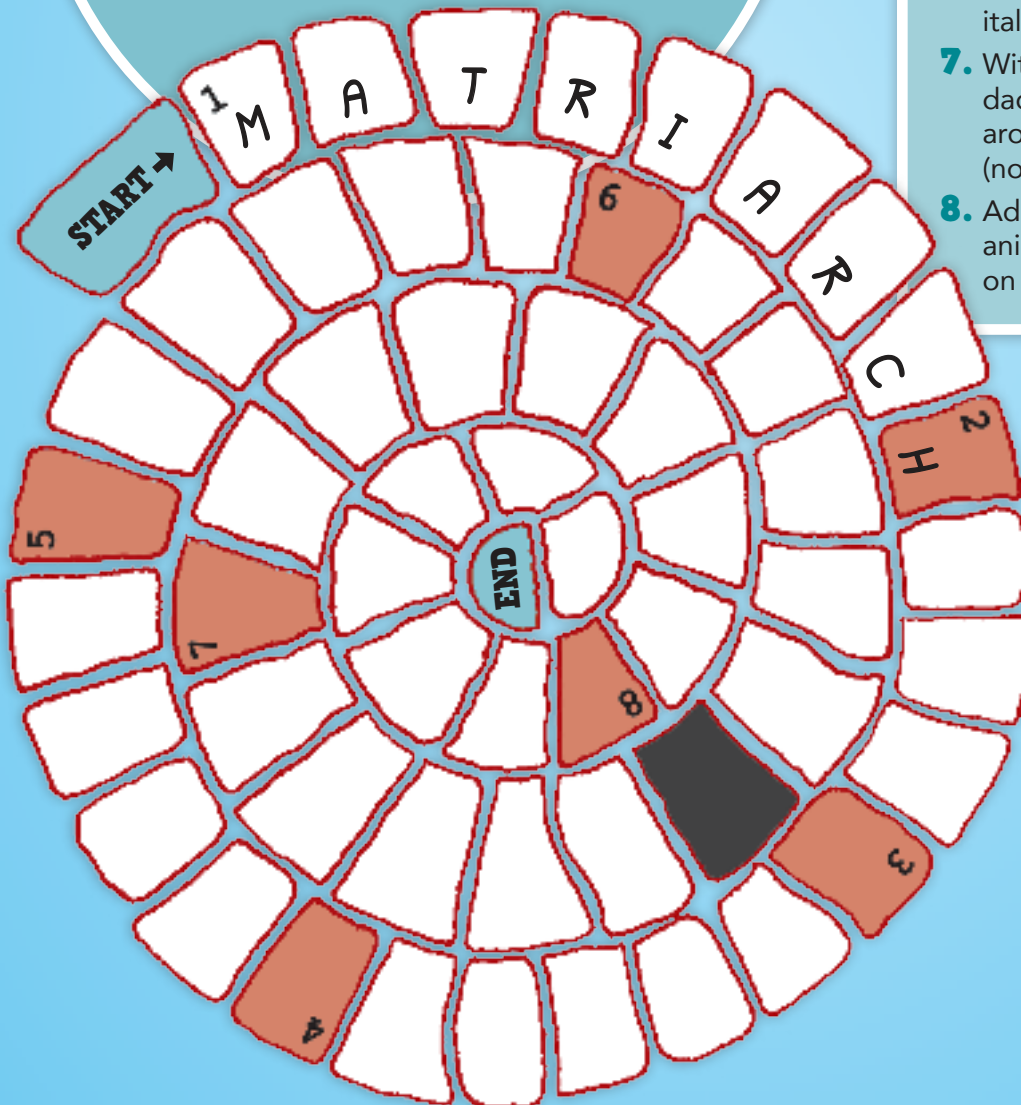
BABY Talk

Let's talk baby talk.
